

REPORT FROM THE

CHAIR

I am pleased to inform members that the Victorian Government has allocated an additional \$100,000 to the VMSA for a network strengthening project.

This is a pilot project for twelve months from 1 July this year. Some areas of Victoria don't have regular network meetings, while some networks have lost a bit of momentum because of the pandemic.

By increasing connections between sheds, the network strengthening project will help shedders to get together with other shedders in their area to share ideas and information and help each other out. Increasing the frequency, scale and spread of network meetings will be useful for:

- Members who are experienced in governance roles can provide confidence, knowledge and support for shedders new to the role.
- Sharing ideas on shed projects around what works and what to look out for.
- Sharing information on health supports in the local area.
- Getting guest speakers along that might not have time to visit each shed but can make it to talk to a larger group.
- Developing non-government and corporate sponsorship and funding opportunities.

Next steps will see VMSA mapping the state to get a better picture of what's happening in terms of network meetings now and identifying areas where more can be done.

I encourage shed committees to get involved in this project as it has the potential to strengthen existing men's shed networks and develop new networks where there are none.

The VMSA will contact your shed in the next few months to learn more about your network.



TANGAMBALANGA-KIEWA MEN'S SHED

UPDATE

In October 2023 the Tangambalanga-Kiewa Men's Shed received some bad news from the Indigo Shire Council. As a consequence of the redevelopment of the Kiewa River Park site where the Shed is located, they would be forced to vacate by 1 May 2024.

Apart from offering to ascertain the shed's views on this subject, the shire offered no alternative arrangements.

After a long battle to save the shed, its president Jack Britton says that as a result of their campaign and the fantastic support received from men's sheds across the state, they have been granted an extension which will enable them to stay at the current site until September. This will give the committee more time to sort out arrangements to give the shed a future.

The shire has also offered to supply two containers to be used as a temporary shed. They will be placed at Coulston Park, a sports facility in Tangambalanga and the Coulston park committee say they are happy to support the construction of a new men's shed on their grounds.

So, while this matter is not fully resolved, Jack says it is now starting to head in the right direction. He added that at long last there are positive communications with the shire.

The fact that they have got to this point is a real credit to Jack and the committee who have staunchly defended their shed and have fought on regardless.

Jack says he would like to thank all of the men's sheds across the state who backed them up with emails and messages of support and added that if they ever need help that they could count on the Tangambalanga-Kiewa men's shed.

Once all the relocation details to the new site are sorted out the committee will start making grant applications and fundraising to build a new men's shed in Tangambalanga.

Any shed wishing to donate to this campaign can do so once the details are published in the VMSA

Newsletter, website and Facebook in the near future.

Having spent my first few weeks finding my feet in the new role and visiting sheds in the eastern suburbs, it was time to get my passport and my maps out and take off on what will hopefully become many trips to regional Victoria. Not only did I get to see some beautiful country and heaps of wildlife (not all sleeping on the side of the road), but I also got to meet some great shedders.

It all started in the metropolis that is Cabbage Tree Creek (Cabbage Tree is a palm tree and not a tree that grows cabbages—thanks, Google). I was welcomed by the shedders with a hot cuppa and some homemade biscuits (note to self: always arrive at smoko or lunch). The Cabbage Tree shedders have a great shed, mainly doing woodwork, but they were fixing a radio while I was there. Like most sheds, they can turn their hand to anything. Congrats to them for securing a grant to develop a garden for the men.

Moving on, I headed to Bemm River, which I was assured was only a short journey (another note to self: don't believe them when they tell you it's just up the road). I arrived in Bemm Rive and I was introduced to the Men's Shed with the most accurate statement of the week: "We are not your usual shed. We are a bit different." And so it proved. The men here have a great setup based around butchery and beer. The guys butcher venison and brew fine beer, with a bit of woodwork and emergency support thrown in for good measure. They also do a nice line in hats—cheers for mine.

I finished up day one in Mallacoota and visited the community shed and neighbourhood house. It's a facility that certainly serves its community well.

Back on the road early Tuesday on my way to Lake Entrance. It was a great day indeed, meeting sheds at the health expo. Special thanks to Stuart from AMSA and all at the Lakes Entrance Men's Shed for hosting a great event. We had super presentations and a good workshop. Moss Mahony did a particularly great address to the group around men's health and prostate cancer awareness, ending up with a room full of blokes with blue nail varnish on their fingers, which, as he said, "is the only finger involved in getting a prostate check. So get checked."

So, onwards and upwards to the Orbost Men's Shed on Wednesday, where I learned about laser printing on wood and the good relationship the shed has with its health service, which, as well as being the landlord, also regularly gives the men the once-over medically. A healthy shed is a productive one.

After that, it was back towards Melbourne. The drive back gave me plenty of time to ruminate over what I've seen over the past few days. Here are a few of my takeaways:

- Sheds matter. They are a massive part of their communities, no matter the size of the shed.
- It's good to talk. Everyone is keen to be in a local network. We just need to find someone to organize it (VMSA is working on it).
- There is no standard shed. They come in all shapes and sizes with lots of different activities that serve the community well.
- No shedder has any idea of distance. Everywhere is "just up the road."
- Trust your satnav.

My sincerest thanks to all the sheds that let me in and made me so welcome. I will definitely be back. You live in a beautiful part of the world, and your communities are very lucky to have you. I will be back on the road soon, working my way through Victoria, so I hope that I get to say hello, g'day, or howaya?

DEFIBRILLATOR INSTALLATION AT

OUYEN

Ouyen has made significant strides in increasing access to life-saving care by installing its fourth 24/7 publicly accessible automated external defibrillator (AED) at the Ouyen Men's Shed (26 Rowe Street, Ouyen).

"Cardiac arrest can happen to anyone, anytime, anywhere," said Ambulance Victoria (AV) Acting Mildura Paramedic Community Support Coordinator, Jacob McEwan. "About 20 Victorians suffer a cardiac arrest every day, and sadly, only one in 10 survive. However, when a patient receives CPR and a shock from an AED before paramedics arrive, their chance of survival more than doubles."

The new AED, funded by the volunteer group Heartbeat Sunraysia, joins 11 other AEDs in the Mildura LGA, with four accessible 24/7. Heartbeat Sunraysia has funded about a dozen AEDs across the region and donates funds for various medical equipment to support AV and local hospitals.

Jacob urged the community to ensure all defibrillators are registered with AV to help call takers direct bystanders and First Responders during emergencies. To register a defibrillator, visit the 'Register My AED' website. He also encouraged locals to sign up for the GoodSAM app, which connects those willing to perform CPR with individuals in cardiac arrest in the crucial minutes before paramedics arrive. The app can also be used to locate the nearest publicly accessible AED and see the hours it is available.

"AEDs are safe, easy to use, and will not deliver a shock unless necessary. Simply open it and follow the instructions," Jacob added. "Every minute matters during a cardiac arrest, so having more AEDs around town means bystanders and First Responders can get to them quicker during a medical emergency."


Awareness events and activities can help build relationships, strengthen partnerships, and bring recognition to various local and regional efforts to address elder abuse.

Here are some ideas:

- Organize a "Letter to the Editor" campaign to spotlight elder abuse and promote local resources from your agency or community partners.
- Reach isolated older adults through direct mailing, ads in local newspapers, and radio interviews. Include elder abuse prevention information in community and neighborhood association newsletters or e-Newsletters.
- Download STEAP Toolkit materials and distribute them at community events.
- Partner with local organizations, schools, and agencies and organize food, personal care, or cleaning supply collection drives. Assemble packages and include copies of elder abuse awareness brochures.
- Host a "shred-a-thon" shredding event for your community to safely destroy and dispose of sensitive documents.
- Offer or share information about volunteer service opportunities.

How it will work

Like all Australian container deposit schemes, beverage suppliers will fund the Victorian CDS.

To ensure an efficient, low-cost scheme and one that maximises container returns and recycling Victoria's CDS will adopt a split responsibility governance model with beverage industry having a strong role in administration and funding of the scheme.

The Victorian CDS will create new economic opportunities and jobs, with the responsibilities for running the scheme split between a scheme coordinator and network operators, appointed using a competitive tender process.

Coordinator role:

- · manage finances and commercial viability
- audits to prevent fraud
- pay refund amounts and collection network costs to network operator/s
- · report against government performance targets.

Network operator/s role:

- · establish and maintain a network of refund points
- · distribute refund amounts to consumers
- distribute payments to collection point operators
- · report on participation and redemption rates.

Why are we doing it this way?

Our scheme adopts key elements from other schemes to maximise return of drink containers for recycling. By sharing responsibility for its operation, the scheme will have checks and balances so it is clear and accountable and ensure collection points are convenient and accessible, which is crucial for an effective CDS.

We meet regularly with our Community Organisations Reference Group, made up representatives from charity and community groups, to make sure the way we set up our CDS means they can take part and benefit.


