IN LOVING MEMORY BRUCE WARD

Former VMSA Board member Bruce Ward passed away on the 26th of May surrounded by his loved ones.

Bruce's long involvement in the men's shed movement began in the early days when he was approached to write grants for men's sheds.

Prior to this Bruce had a long involvement with surf lifesaving and had won volunteer of the year awards both in Victoria and nationally.

Bruce played a pivotal role as coordinator of the Steering Group which established the Ocean Grove and District Men's Shed Inc. in 2009/10. His involvement as a committee leader continued until he became seriously ill earlier this year.

He served as secretary, treasurer and steering committee coordinator during this time and provided strong and clear leadership from its foundation through to the present.

Bruce served on the VMSA Board for six years and was secretary of the board for four of those years. During this period, he attended gatherings all over the state, helped numerous sheds in need of advice or support and attended VMSA and AMSA conferences.

Bruce also volunteered his time and energy and was a tireless worker on behalf of not only his shed but also the wider men's shed movement.

He was a respected and highly regarded figure who will be sorely missed.

REPORT FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

Hi Shedders,

Over the past month, I've been lucky enough to visit a number of sheds in different corners of the state.

During a recent trip to the North East, I stopped by Rutherglen, Yackandandah, Mount Beauty, Wangaratta and Thurgoona.

The Murray-Hume network meeting Thurgoona provided a chance to meet with representatives of over 20 sheds from both sides of the border. Some of the highlights included a feature on a dementia program initiated by Wodonga MS, an opportunity for the Tangam-Kiewa President Jack Britten to speak about the campaign to save their shed and hearing the latest news from AMSA's shed support coordinator Beth Gow.

As I headed back down the Hume with a bag of fresh Wangaratta lemons in my back seat, it was good to reflect on the strength of the sheds that I had visited and the great characters that I had met along the way. My next multi-day trip will be to the state's North West in late June.

Other sheds that I have visited in the past month include Monash, Dingley Village, Monbulk and Mornington. With most of these being large, strong sheds, I have been doing some thinking about how some of the bigger, better resourced sheds can offer peer support and possibly resources to others that may not be doing so well. We're looking to trial some of this peer support work this month, focussing on the current hot topic, attaining DGR status.

Regarding men's health, there are a couple of regional multi-shed events happening in different parts of the state that the VMSA will be attending (at Hopetoun and Lake's Entrance), and this will provide us with further opportunities to work in collaboration with AMSA.

MARYSVILLE MEN'S SHED

In a recent turn of events, Marysville Men's Shed found itself on the brink of closure due to the prospect of having no committee volunteers. However, just when things seemed dire, a glimmer of hope emerged as a group of volunteers agreed to shoulder this responsibility and this has proven to be a game-changer for their shed.

One of the new committee volunteers, Barry Dovey has penned some words about the shed and it's interesting history:

"Marysville, Just a little town north east of Melbourne, one part of a triangle of the small towns of Buxton and Narbethong. Once Marysville was the heart of the honeymoon destination, lots of guest houses to look after a couple wanting to get away from the city, just 4 hours by bus from central Melbourne, into a little town surrounded by bush, waterfalls and rivers.

But, in 2009 the fires came to town, burnt most of the town, no more guest houses, the buses stopped coming, but as the ashes cooled, the locals got stuck in to rebuild their town, today Marysville is home to something like 430 people most have gray hair or would have without the skills of the local hairdresser.

As the rebuild got underway, the locals pooled resources and the Marysville mens shed was born. The originators created a fantastic resource, a two level building, fully air conditioned, wonderful kitchen, large meeting table, pool table, two workshops, one for woodworking, one for metal engineering, just a great resource. "

The VMSA wishes the Marysville Men's Shed all the very best as they continue to keep the shed doors open and offer a place of friendship and collaboration for the men in the local area.








RUTHERGLEN MEN'S SHED


Awareness events and activities can help build relationships, strengthen partnerships, and bring recognition to various local and regional efforts to address elder abuse.

Here are some ideas:

- Organize a "Letter to the Editor" campaign to spotlight elder abuse and promote local resources from your agency or community partners.
- Reach isolated older adults through direct mailing, ads in local newspapers, and radio interviews. Include elder abuse prevention information in community and neighborhood association newsletters or e-Newsletters.
- Download STEAP Toolkit materials and distribute them at community events.
- Partner with local organizations, schools, and agencies and organize food, personal care, or cleaning supply collection drives. Assemble packages and include copies of elder abuse awareness brochures.
- Host a "shred-a-thon" shredding event for your community to safely destroy and dispose of sensitive documents.
- Offer or share information about volunteer service opportunities.

Victoria's container deposit scheme

Designed for all Victorians

Victoria's container deposit scheme (CDS) will:

- 🗘 increase recycling and reduce litter by up to half
- 🗘 be convenient and accessible with many types and locations of collection points
- O bring new jobs and economic opportunities for disadvantaged people, charity and community groups, and regional Victoria.

It's a new and accessible way for charities and community groups to raise money:

- collecting containers for refunds
- running container collection drives
- receiving donations people will be able to donate their refunds to their favourite registered group
- running a refund collection point.

Purchase drinks Recycling cost is included in the price.

Return empty containers

to a variety of locations across Victoria, including shops, reverse vending machines, depots, pop-ups and drop-off points. Run by recyclers, small business and charity, community and sports groups.

Container refunds Ten-cent refund per

container to person who returns it and/or charity, community and sports groups.

Recycle containers

reducing the need for new materials.

How it will work

Like all Australian container deposit schemes, beverage suppliers will fund the Victorian CDS.

To ensure an efficient, low-cost scheme and one that maximises container returns and recycling Victoria's CDS will adopt a split responsibility governance model with beverage industry having a strong role in administration and funding of the scheme.

The Victorian CDS will create new economic opportunities and jobs, with the responsibilities for running the scheme split between a scheme coordinator and network operators, appointed using a competitive tender process.

Coordinator role:

- manage finances and commercial viability
- audits to prevent fraud
- pay refund amounts and collection network costs to network operator/s
- report against government performance targets.

Network operator/s role:

- · establish and maintain a network of refund points
- distribute refund amounts to consumers
- distribute payments to collection point operators
- report on participation and redemption rates.

Why are we doing it this way?

Our scheme adopts key elements from other schemes to maximise return of drink containers for recycling. By sharing responsibility for its operation, the scheme will have checks and balances so it is clear and accountable and ensure collection points are convenient and accessible, which is crucial for an effective CDS.

We meet regularly with our Community Organisations Reference Group, made up representatives from charity and community groups, to make sure the way we set up our CDS means they can take part and benefit.


